# Post-War Trends in Labor Income in the Social Security Earnings Public-Use File 

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## SSA Earnings Public-Use File (EPUF)

- Individual-year data, 1951-2006
- Random sample of 3.13 million persons
- Had covered earnings in at least one year
- Limits to protect confidentiality:
- Demographic data: Gender \& Year of birth
- Slight "perturbing" of earnings data
- No information on place of residence or mortality
- No information on SS benefits


## SSA Earnings Public-Use File (EPUF)

- Evolution of age-earnings profiles, 1951-2006
- Shift in women's relative earnings compared with men's
- Link between age of entry into workforce and peak earnings attained in career
- Link between age of exit from workforce and peak earnings in career
- Earnings measured in 2010 dollars
- Or as \% of economy-wide average annual wage
